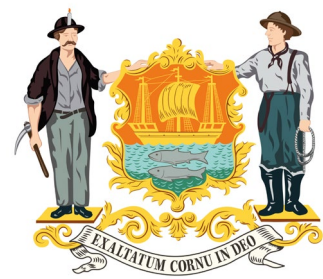

A burst of colour to Truro's City Centre once again

Truro City Council Parks department have been busy planting the raised flower beds around the city centre this week in the anticipation of the town re opening.

The award-winning team have replanted the beds along Pydar Street with Geraniums that were propagated in the Boscawen Park Nursery. Truro in Bloom have also started planting outside the Boys Club on St Austell Street with plants kindly donated from Allet Nurseries.

Wild flower seeds have also been scattered in various areas around the city.

Richard Budge, Truro City council Parks & Amenities Manager said, “We are keen to get some colour and cheer back into the town centre to brighten people’s lives in the new normal”.

The Mayor of Truro Bert Biscoe said:

‘Everybody is rightly very cautious about easing the lockdown, but Spring is advancing. The Parks Department is eager to get the town centre looking inviting and bright.
